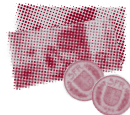
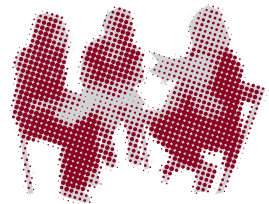
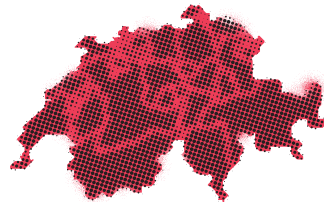


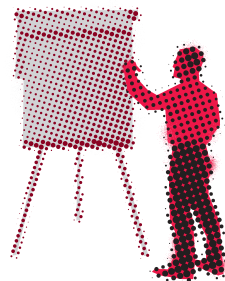
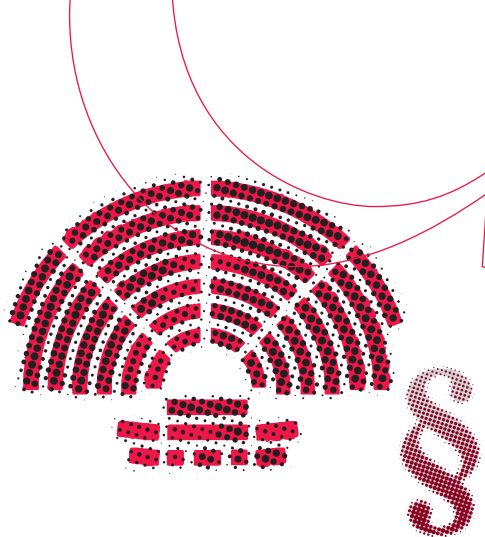


The KPM Center for Public Management

Issues relating to the public sector affect society as a whole. Which tasks are the responsibility of the state and which should the private sector manage? What funds should the state have at its disposal? What is the role of civil servants? Ultimately, how well does the state address the issues it is entrusted with?

The KPM Center for Public Management at the University of Bern addresses precisely these issues. The interfaculty institute was established in 2002, and, with its staff of around 50, it stands at the interface between theory and practice. The KPM Center has a network of national and international partners in science, politics, management, and economy. It provides important contributions to the transfer of knowledge between higher education and practice in the University of Bern's strategic priority topic of "Politics and Public Administration", making it an important pillar of higher education and research in the Swiss capital region.





Study Programs

Master of Arts in Public Management and Policy (Master PMP)

The Master of Arts in Public Management and Policy is an inter-university degree provided by the Universities of Bern, Lausanne, and the Università della Svizzera italiana. This specialized master's degree is designed to reflect the increasing complexity of the public sector. It stands out due to its conjunction of various disciplines within the administrative sciences and its inter-university training.

Target Group: The Master of Arts in PMP is primarily aimed at students with a Bachelor's degree in business administration, political science, legal studies, political economy, sociology or media studies and communications. Students with a Bachelor's degree in another subject may be admitted under special consideration.

Program Structure: The degree, with a total of 120 ECTS, consists of a basic study

course (1st year) followed by an in-depth study course (2nd year). It is possible to complete the second year at a partner university. The master's thesis can be combined with an internship.

Minor in "Public Administration" for Political Science and Sport Science Master's Students

The Minor in "Public Administration" is aimed at students who are majoring in Political Science at the University of Bern. The minor comprises 30 ECTS that may be obtained by attending courses offered at the KPM Center. The minor is also open to students of Sport Science.

Continued Education and Executive Training

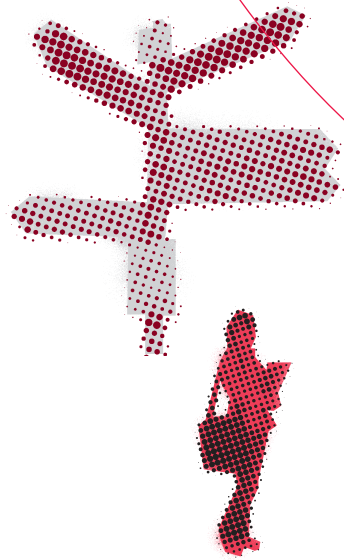
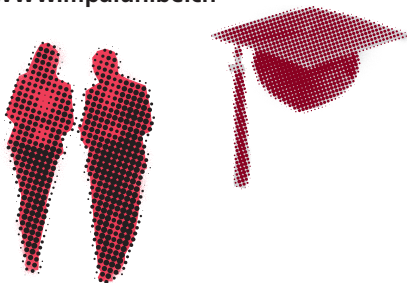
Executive Master of Public Administration (MPA)

The "Executive MPA" program provides leadership training for the public sector in Switzerland. This extra-occupational Master of Advanced Studies (MAS) university training (60 ECTS) is aimed at (potential) senior-level civil service staff in the public sector and has been shown to bolster a person's employment market value.

This executive degree, which has both a practical and an academic focus, provides the interdisciplinary knowledge and skills required for a successful career.

The course has a compact design with regular week-long blocks. It is run every two years and internationally accredited (EAPAA). The alumni society, which has approximately 200 members, provides training and networking opportunities.

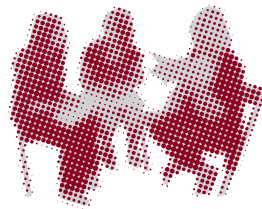


Certificate of Advanced Studies (CAS) in Public Administration (CeMaP)

The CAS in "Public Administration" (CeMaP) (15 ECTS) is aimed at senior-level civil servants in executive managerial positions in public institutions and non-profit-organizations who seek to update their knowledge within a short period of time.

The one-year course is offered in German by the University of Bern in cooperation with the University of St. Gallen. The University of Lausanne offers the course in French.

The KPM Center initiates and conducts research projects in the field of Public Administration with the goal of obtaining high international visibility and providing direct practical experience.

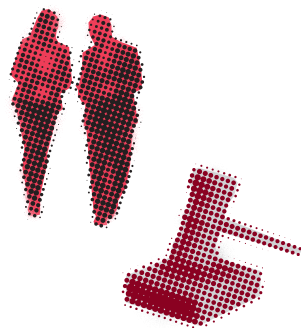

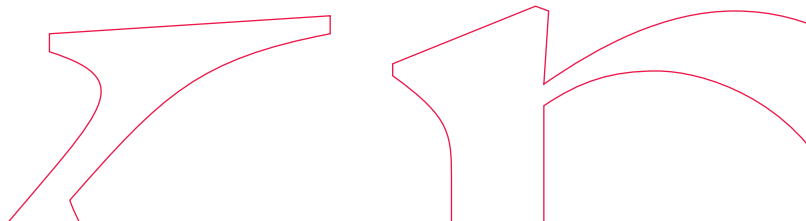
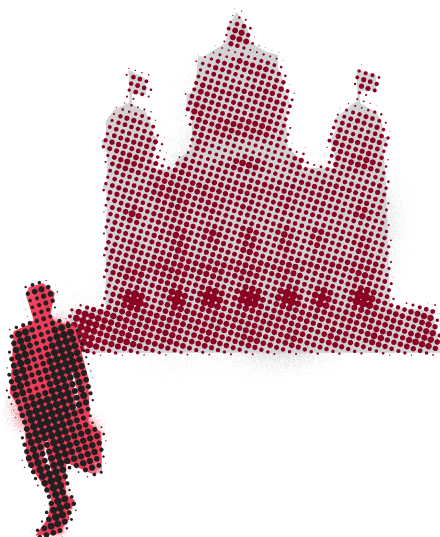
Services

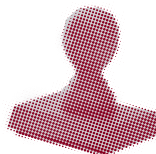
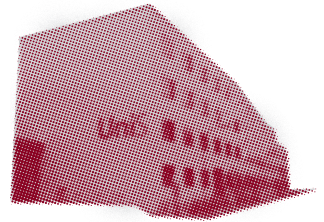

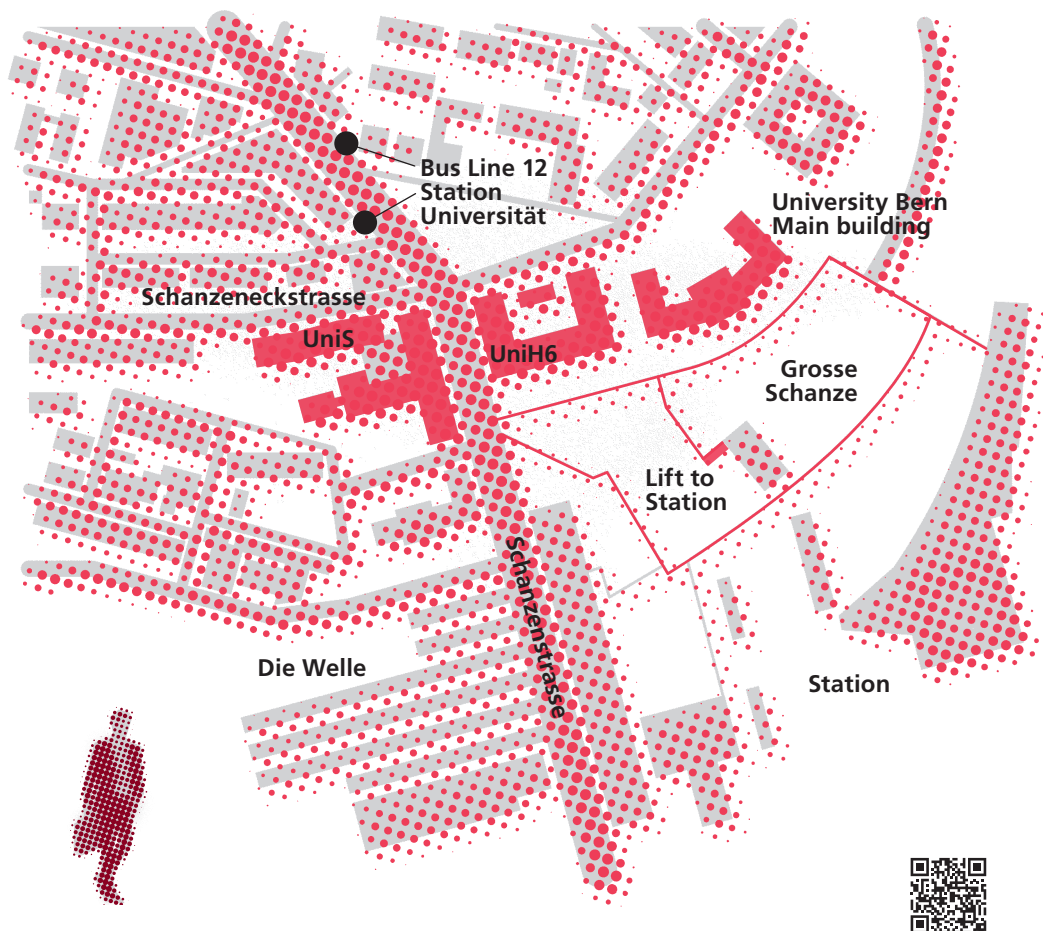
